6.4 Rates in	ı Pay Plan
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- (a) The pay range for each job shall consist of a range minimum and maximum, with the range divided into equal increments of 4%, except for the final increment which may be either 4% or less.

6.14 Merit Increase

(a) When a new employee has been continuously employed, without a break in service of one or more working days for a period of six months, he/she becomes eligible for, and may be granted, a merit increase of one step provided

- that the appointing authority has determined that the employee's performance merits such an award.
- (b) At the end of an employee's twelfth month of continuous employment, the employee may be granted a merit increase of one step if the appointing authority has determined that his/her performance merits such an award. At the end of each subsequent twelve month period of such continuous employment the employee will be eligible for additional merit increase until that employee reaches the maximum period. This date of eligibility shall be known as an anniversary date and shall not change with such continuous employment within the classified service.
